






- Reform of the Nomination Process

Norway strengthens its support for the protection of Natural World Heritage

Monday, 29 July 2019 at 15:00:00



On 16 July 2019, US\$ 2.9 million (NOK 25 million) were received from Norway as part of a partnership agreement signed last month supporting UNESCO's work in various fields, including heritage preservation.

These funds will be dedicated to the preservation of natural World Heritage sites in Africa. The significant increase in Norway's contribution widtly demonstrates its commitment to the protection of natural heritage, in the wake of the announcement in 2016 that the Norwegian parliament adopted zero-emission regulations in World Heritage (pirots).

Draft Decision: 43 COM 7B.3

The World Heritage Committee,

- 1. Having examined Document WHC/19/43.COM/7B.Add,
- Haiving examined bocument wH-CT9443 COM/PL ARD,
 Recalling Decision 41 COM TB.25, adopted at its 41st session (Krakow, 2017),
 Welcomes the formation of an India-Bangladesh Joint Working Group (JWG) of the Sundarbans and requests the State Party of Bangladesh to keep the World Heritage Centre informed of the concrete actions and outcomes that arise from the JWG and how these will strengthen the long-term protection of the property's Cutstanding Universal Value (CUV).
- Universal Value (OUV):
 Appreciates the confirmation that any future dredging of the Pashur River will be subject to an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), reminds the State Party that EIAs should be conducted in line with the IUCN World Heritage Advice Note on Environmental Assessment and include a specific section on the potential impact of the project on the OUV of the property, and also requests the State Party to ensure that any dredging within the property is conducted in compliance with strict conditions that safeguard the property's OUV.—and further requests the State Party to provide information on dredging activities.
